The celebration began with a welcome by Dr. Sharon Crockett-Ray, Director of Institutional Advancement, followed by a song, "We've Come This Far by Faith" by Karen Baker. The highlight of the event was a speech, entitled "Dream Realized" given by St. Philip's College President Dr. Adena Williams Loston.

Marsha Hall, Director of Strategic Initiatives read "Collect Commemorating a Saint", a poem selected from the book "A Great Cloud of Witnesses." The event concluded with a \$2,500 check presentation from the Living in God's Love Gospel Choir and final thoughts.

SPC Participates in Juneteenth Parade

On Saturday, June 17, St. Philip's College proudly honored the newest federal holiday of Juneteenth by participating in San Antonio's annual Juneteenth Parade. As a Historically Black College, celebrating its 125 years of existence, the holiday commemorating the end of slavery holds great significance.

The parade began at 10 a.m. at Sam Houston High School and ended 3.3 miles away at the Comanche Park #2. A group of over 30 students, faculty, staff, and administration took to the streets with passion, representing SPC with great pride in the community. Spectators waved, high-fived and cheered for the college as they marched by.

Varryron Young, Associate Director of Student Success for Student Life expressed excitement at attending his first Juneteenth parade saying, "I had fun reconnecting with old friends and coworkers and also networking with new community partners to strengthen the college's mission for student success."

The college's participation in Juneteenth was not limited to the parade. Leading up to the event, students and employees engaged in campus events that highlighted the historical significance. Congratulations to St. Philip's College student Jabrasia Doss for her selection to participate in the U.S. Department of Education, White House Initiative on Advancing Equity, Educational Excellence and Economic Opportunity through Historically Black Colleges and Universities, 2023 HBCU Scholar Recognition Program.

This program recognizes outstanding student leaders and further empowers them with tools for excellence. This year's cohort is made up of 101 HBCU Scholars, the largest cohort in the history of the program. The theme for this year is, "Raising the Bar: Forging Excellence Through Innovation & Leadership."

"Students have the opportunity to work on a team project with representatives from NASA. Teams present their projects to all attendees at the Annual HBCU conference.

They can participate in a Career and Recruitment Fair, meet students from other HBCUs, and return to their

schools to share ideas for a better student experience," said Dr. Angela McPherson Williams, St. Philip's College Director of Student Life.

As a 2023 HBCU Scholar, Jabrasia will serve as a student ambassador for the Initiative and St. Philip's College, ensuring information, resources, and opportunities are distributed to both campuses. She will also network with other scholars, federal agencies, and private partners to showcase her talent across the HBCU community.

Jabrasia was chosen for her combination of academic achievements, campus leadership, civic engagement, and entrepreneurial spirit which distinguished her candidacy.
