Welcome Dr. Reno

Northeast Campus President, Dr. Eric Reno joined the Alamo Community College District as the President of the new college on August 2. Eric Reno brings thirty years of community college education to his new position. Previous to ACCD he was president of Red Rocks Community College in Lakewood CO, and vice president and CEO of the Larimer Campus of Front Range Community College in Fort Collins, CO. Eric started his community college career at Broward Community College in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida-beginning as a student and leaving as vice president for academic affairs.

He is a first generation college student, entering a community college after four years in the Air Force-basic training at Lackland AFB, on year technical school at Goodfellow AFB in San Angelo, and three years at RAF Chicksands in Shefford, England. He then earned his bachelor's degree in English from Florida Atlantic University, his master's degree in English from San Francisco State University (while experiencing five years of corporate life with United Airlines), and his doctorate in higher education from Florida Atlantic.

His teaching areas have included composition, literature, and film-and graduate courses in higher education at Florida International University and Colorado State University. He also has had significant involvement in international education as a consultant in Malaysia and Singapore, and as a coordinator of programs in London and Cambridge, England.

During his six years at Red Rocks Community College he was on the boards of the Denver West Chamber, the Arvada Economic Development Association (AEDA), the Jefferson Economic Council (JEC), and chaired the Colorado Campus Compact for service learning and the Gateway District of the Boy Scouts of America. Nationally he serves as president-elect of the College Consortium for International Studies (CCIS) and the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) Commission on Global Education. He received the Colorado Community College President of the Year Award from the State Student Advisory Council in 2001 and 2004, and in 2002 received the Shirley B. Gordon Award of Distinction from Phi Theta Kappa, the international honor society for two-year colleges.

He feels fortunate to be joining ACCD and is looking forward to working with new education and community college colleagues in developing and building a community college that incorporates the experiences and values learned in the 20th century, and the rapidly moving challenges and opportunities we face today. He believes strongly that community colleges are built through partnerships with all segments of the communities they serve and is proud to have been part of the leadership in Broward Community College that developed joint-use libraries (community college and public), university centers, and corporate training facilities on new campuses. An accomplishment he hopes to replicate at the Northeast College was to carry his experience of joint-use libraries in Florida to his position in Colorado, resulting in the construction of the first college and public joint-use library in the state.

Eric is married to Patricia, an elementary school teacher, and they have three children. Patrick, age 22, and a student at the University of Oregon; and Amanda and Alaina, age 15 juniors in high school.
