Mr. Lieke
Knows Numbers!!!



Raised on a farm, Mr. Lieke did a lot of manual labor in his lifetime. He attended public schools at Pawnee, Texas and graduated from high school in 1961. After graduation he attended Texas Lutheran College (now Texas Lutheran University) in Seguin, Texas.

He attended college by receiving a football scholarship and received a B.S. in secondary education with a major in math and a minor in business in 1965. He started his career as a public school teacher, teaching 7th and 8th grade math, and also coached in George West, Texas in 1965.

In 1967, he moved to Skidmore, Texas to teach in the Skidmore-Tynan Schools. He taught 7th and 8th grade math there along with high school geometry and book-keeping. While teaching there he studied for his masters degree in math and secondary education, and received his degree in August of 1971. He continued his education courses for mid-management and held a position as a part-time principal.



In 1987, he moved to New Braunfels and taught in the New Braunfels ISD middle school where he coached and taught math. He retired from the public school system in 1999.

Since 1999, Mr. Lieke has taught math as adjunct faculty for St. Phillips College.

Mr. Lieke is married to his high school sweetheart and has three children and two grandsons. They proudly await their third grandchild in November of this year.

In his spare time, Mr. Lieke takes care of his land and cattle. He enjoys hunting, playing cards and dominoes.
