## San Antonio College presents 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Book Fair

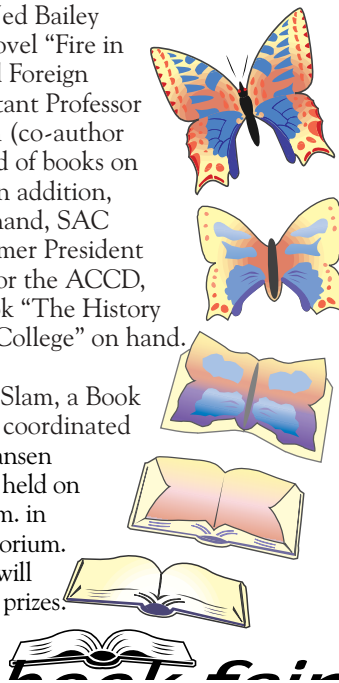
The 10th Annual San Antonio College Book Fair will be held on Saturday, April 2, 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. outside near the Gym and Planetarium, featuring approximately 50 authors from San Antonio and throughout the state who will sell their books and discuss their work in two large Texas Author Tents. In addition, booksellers and writers' organizations will join musicians, clowns, face painters, food vendors, book costume characters, and more for this festive, family-friendly event.

Among the authors appearing will be SAC English Professor Carol Coffee Reposa (author of three books of poetry, including "Facts of Life"), History Instructor Richard Buitron (author of "The Quest for Tejano Identity in San Antonio, Texas, 1913-2000"), Counselor Kimberley McConnell (author of "Put a Lid on It"), English Instructor Paul Perry (author of several short story collections,

including "Street People"), English Professor Irma Ned Bailey (author of the novel "Fire in the Bones"), and Foreign Languages Assistant Professor Wanda Kaufman (co-author with her husband of books on fortifications). In addition, Dr. Jerome Weynand, SAC alumnus and former President of the Colleges for the ACCD, will have his book "The History of San Antonio College" on hand.

Also, the Poetry Slam, a Book Fair Week event coordinated by Jane Focht-Hansen (English), will be held on March 29 at 7 p.m. in McAllister Auditorium. ACCD students will compete for cash prizes.
