GENERAL INFORMATION

- Know what they don't know

- Understand research jargon, e.g., "peerreviewed"
- Follow the steps of a research process
- Estimate time needed for research
- Generate a research question

FIND

- Find different formats of sources
- Differentiate between internet search engines & library databases
- Distinguish between online catalogs and databases
- Brainstorm keywords & alternate terms for a topic
- Conduct effective searches using Boolean operators (AND, OR, NOT)
- Find & Use controlled vocabulary, e.g., subject terms
- Search by field, e.g., author, title
- Distinguish format of items in search results (book chapter vs journal article)
- Use encyclopedias appropriately
- Find full text of articles
- Find books using Library of Congress classification (LC)
- Know how to revise a search

- Summarize, analyze, & critique the words & ideas of others ethically
- Use various citation styles
- Use in-text citations

- Analyze search results for relevance & credibility
- Distinguish between popular & scholarly sources
- Evaluate information & sources critically
