


Figure 15-1: Retention Rates—1st to 2nd year first time degree seeking undergraduates, fall 2015 (2011 cohort) and fall 2016 (2012 cohort) Data Source: Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

Retention Rate

As seen in Figure 15-1 (above), SPC had a slight decrease in full time retention from fall 2015 to fall 2016, but there was an equivalent increase in part time student retention for the same period.

Graduation Rate




Figure 15-2: Graduation rates of full time, first time degree/cert.-seeking undergraduates in normal time (100%), 150% & 200% of normal time Data Source: IPEDS

Displayed in *Figure 15-2* (below), SPC graduation rate between 2015 (2011 cohort) and 2016 (2012 cohort) remained the same for 200% completion time, increased slightly for 150% completion time, and decreased slightly for 100% (normal) completion time.
