International Programs

In China, students will embark on a whirlwind tour throughout the country experiencing a new language, business system, gazing upon historical landmarks, and immersing themselves in a culture far from their own. China offers a unique experience into global business opportunities and Business majors are encouraged to apply.

PROGRAM DATE: June 10 – 14 at SAC campus; June 16-July 6, 2019 in country

PROGRAM SITE: Beijing, Xi'an, Dunhuang, Chegdu, China

COURSES: Elementary Chinese I (CHIN 1411) or Elementary Chinese II (CHIN 1412) and Business Principles (BUSI 1301)

ACADEMIC INFORMATION: Students are required to take two courses and will receive seven hours of credit upon successful completion of the program.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS: 2.0 **GPA** and 12 cumulative academic credits. Alamo Colleges District expects study abroad participants perform academically to at standards commensurate performance. with on campus includes attending taking exams, reading classes, required materials, completing homework, etc. If students' GPA drops below a 2.0 before they study abroad, they will not be allowed to participate in the program.

FACULTY LEADERS:

Professor Shen Jiang is the lead faculty for Introduction to Chinese I and II. She has taught Chinese in the Foreign Language Department at San Antonio College since 2010. Professor Jiang holds a Master's degree in Linguistics and Computer Information Systems and led the China Study Abroad Program in the summers of 2010, 2012, 2015 2016, and 2018. She is a Chinese native.
