Policy B.1.1 – Board Legal Status

Engagement of Independent Audit Firm for FY2018

The Board approved and authorized execution of a one-year engagement letter, which is the fourth year engagement under a five-year contract with Grant Thornton LLP providing for the purchase of independent financial audit services for Alamo Colleges District for Fiscal Year 2018 in an amount not to exceed \$290,660 (47.5% or \$138,224 covers required Federal and State Single Audits). The Board also authorized an additional fee ranging from \$18,613 to \$22,500 per program/cluster should further individual federal and/or state program revenue rise to a materiality level requiring audit. State statute requires an annual audit by independent certified public accountants. The purpose of the independent audit is to provide assurance, based on independent review and testing, that the basic financial statements and accompanying notes are fairly stated in all material aspects in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applicable to financial audits contained in the Government Auditing Standards. The audit is also designed to meet the requirements of the Federal Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Uniform Guidance "Super Circular" and the State Single Audit related to the Uniform Grant Management Standards. For 2018, the audit services will include an independent auditor's report for the Alamo Colleges District – Northeast Lakeview College, as well as an independent auditor's report on the compliance with the Public Funds Investment Act (PFIA).
