Beware: Refund Scams Are on the Rise

Scammers are sending fake emails that look like legitimate communications from the Alamo Colleges District. These messages are designed to trick you into sharing personal or financial information. If you receive a suspicious email, DO NOT click links, open attachments, or reply. Use the red shield icon in Outlook's top toolbar to report the email. Unsure if a refund email is real? <> Log in to your ACES <> student portal to view your account summary & any potential refunds.

The Alamo Colleges District continues to warn students of training and job offer scams in which a person contacts students through their student.alamo.edu email.

The scenario below has been reported, but additional approaches could be occurring.



*Student is emailed a job opportunity as an errand assistant. The opportunity is described as a part-time, flexible position offering \$600 per week and directs student to email the contact directly.



*Student is contacted by email and offered a job along with a check to cover expenses. Student does receive a check, which is refused at the bank as fraudulent.



*Student is emailed a job offer at a local company and a contact name was provided. The email states that the student is to submit a \$2,500 money order to the company. Later, the student receives an offer of funds through a phone app to help pay for the money order.



*Students are contacted by email and offered a campus employment office job opportunity at the convenience of your home or school along with a check to cover expenses.
