The institution submitted the teach-out plan as a program closure. As clarified by telephone (January 7, 2022), the submission is an off-campus instructional site closure as the institution will no longer offer credits toward a program at the location.

Following the fall 2016 semester, the instructor teaching dual-credit courses for the Level 1 Certificate program in Entrepreneurship resigned, and the high school was unable to find a replacement for the position. The high school also partners with another institution to offer other dual-credit courses. The institution is reminded that when it closes a program or instructional site, it has an affirmative obligation to seek closure approval from SACSCOC at the time the closure decision is made. The closure date is the date students are no longer admitted.

Parents and students were informed the courses were no longer an option when the courses were removed from the high school course selection sheets. Students have other opportunities for dual-credit courses with another college and the high school versions of these courses. There is no cost to dual-credit students to take college credit courses.
