Policy Statement

The Alamo Colleges District recognizes the transformative value of online learning and is committed to providing learners from all backgrounds with access to high-quality programs and services that prepare them to lead in a global society. This policy establishes the School for Online Learning at Alamo Colleges District (also known as School for Online Learning) and articulates its purpose, value propositions, scope, and responsibilities in digital and online learning.

Purpose and Value Proposition

The School for Online Learning at Alamo Colleges District ("School") works across Colleges, Schools, and Centers to elevate the quality and consistency of the online learner experience. The School's core value propositions are:

- 1. Advancing quality, consistency, and performance of the online learning experience across the Alamo Colleges District.
- 2. Creating a quality, unique, and differentiated online learning experience by leading, facilitating, and developing the Alamo Colleges District through the AlamoONLINE brand into a pinnacle of excellence recognized internationally for quality and student success.

Scope and Responsibilities

The School for Online Learning at Alamo Colleges District has enterprise-level responsibility for unifying the vision, strategy, and facilitation of operational activities. The School is responsible for establishing and managing district-wide standards for online learning quality, consistency, and strategic direction for digital learning initiatives across the system. The School will lead through robust internal service agreements with each College and ACCESS departments and will be supported by an advisory group of faculty, staff and administrators from across the colleges and district.
