

International Programs

Students will explore London, including tours of Westminster Abbey, the Tower of London, and more. Day trips and tours will include Stonehenge, Stratford -upon-Avon, Canterbury, several palaces, and local schools. Students will visit local English schools to compare methods of educating students of all ages, and visit literary sites to better understand the cultural background of English literature. Program focus will be for Education majors. Participants will be required to complete an internship prior to departure.

COURSES:

Special Populations (EDUC 2301) and English Composition II (ENGL 1302) or British Literature (ENGL 2322)

ACADEMIC INFORMATION:

Students are required to take two courses and will receive six hours of credit upon successful completion of the program.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:

2.0 GPA and 12 cumulative academic credits. Alamo Colleges District expects study abroad participants to perform academically at standards commensurate with on-campus performance. This includes attending classes, taking exams, reading required materials, completing homework, etc. If students' GPA drops below a 2.0 before they study abroad, they will not be allowed to participate in the program.

FACULTYLEADERS:

Professor Angela Brazeal Hager has been teaching at the Alamo Colleges District since 2004. She currently teaches English and Education courses at Northeast Lakeview College. She has previously traveled to several cities in Europe, including London. Professor Hager will be the lead faculty for Freshman Composition II (ENGL 1302). The course satisfies the Core Curriculum and will focus on researching, writing, and reading selected literature by English authors. Professor Hager led the 2018 Study Abroad in England. She will be the lead faculty for English Composition II (ENGL 1302) and British Literature (ENGL 2322). Contact: ahager6@alamo.edu

Professor Pamela Lucas has been teaching for eleven years, nine years at Northeast Lakeview College. Professor Lucas will be the lead faculty for Special Populations (EDUC 2301). The course provides an overview of schooling and classrooms from the perspectives of language, gender, socioeconomic status, ethnic and academic diversity, and equity with an emphasis on factors that facilitate learning. The course provides students with opportunities to participate in early field observations of P-12 special populations, and is aligned as applicable with State Board for Educator Certification Pedagogy and Professional Responsibility.
