This past year has been a joyous celebration for Northeast Lakeview College as we've celebrated 15 years of service in Bexar, Guadalupe, and Comal Counties. The success of our students, faculty, staff, and administration has rippled across the region. Much like the ripples created when a stone is tossed into a river, these ripples continue to expand across the water's surface until they reach the outer banks and make their way back.

Northeast Lakeview College's ripple of impact continues to expand across the region to meet the area's academic and workforce needs. Today, the college is well-positioned to grow and produce nurses, engineers, scientists, business professionals, artists, and social science and humanities scholars. The College has also started graduating more cyber security, coding, logistics, and supply chain management professionals to meet the region's workforce needs.

In support of the area's primary and secondary school education, the College has increased the number of partnerships with the local independent school districts. Christopher Yang, 2018 Distinguished Graduate, Associate of Science







Meaghan Setterbo, 2021 Distinguished Graduate, Associate of Arts




OUR STUDENTS:

Meeting Challenges with Resilience and Support

Northeast Lakeview College remains committed to its overarching goal of providing access to education in the communities that it serves. In doing so, recognizes the hardships and economic struggles associated with ongoing environmental challenges, like social injustice, economic instability, and mental health and wellness. In response, we have met these challenges with resilience and support to leverage the college's financial capacity for the benefit of our students and community partners.

Demonstrating record enrollment numbers in Fall 2022, we successfully transitioned our employees back to on-site working and teaching to ensure our students could continue their academic journey, and allowing us to serve our students in diverse ways to meet each learning style (on campus, remotely, or online).

Embracing one of NLC's core values of "community-engaged," the college partnered with the San Antonio Food Bank (SAFB) to host several Pop-Up Drive thru Food Markets. Averaging assistance to more than 150 families, these pop-up markets began in efforts to support families struggling with food insecurities during the COVID-19 pandemic. Understanding the continued need, NLC is honored to continue the partnership with SAFB and provide this service and support to families in its service area.





Northeast Lakeview College participated in the district-wide AlamoBOOKS+

initiative to provide free text book rentals during the Spring, Summer and Fall 2022 semesters to ensure students have the required textbooks and instructional materials to be successful in their courses by the first day of class. This money saving opportunity is another way NLC is breaking down barriers and providing greater access to education.

Northeast Lakeview College Ranked #12 by Learn.Org as a Recognized School

Named One of the Best Community Colleges in the U.S.

NLC ranked #12 as a recognized school on the list. The 50 best community colleges in the nation were selected based on several factors including school data reported by the U.S. Department of Education, the school's program offerings, student services, and campus activities. Austin Community College ranked #46 and NLC was the only Alamo College to make the list.

Committed to Serving our Military-Affiliated Students

Receiving continued investments from the 87th Texas Legislature, Northeast Lakeview College will be the next site for a new Veterans Center within the Alamo Colleges District, Awarded \$7.7 million, the funds are part of the State of Texas appropriations provided to the Alamo Colleges for the 2022-2023 biennium. This funding will allow for the construction of a stand-alone facility dedicated to providing services to active and retired military and their families, including direct access to academic and non-academic services. NLC broke ground on this facility in November 2022.





Veterans Education Excellence Recognition Award

In recognition of NLC's excellent service to veterans and military-connected students, Northeast Lakeview College received the 2022 Gold Award from the Texas Veterans Commission.

Committed to Student Success

Northeast Lakeview College continues its commitment to provide access to education in the communities that it serves and continues to increase graduation and completion rates annually. In 2021, at 911 graduates, NLC exceeded its graduation target by 33%. Most recently, NLC awarded 952 diplomas and certificates, demonstrating a 4.5% increase in completion rates from the previous year.

Named Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI)

Northeast Lakeview College gained the designation as a Hispanic Serving Institution in 2021. To earn this designation, institutions of higher education should have a student body of 25% or more Hispanics and a high percentage of students must be qualified for federal student loans or grants.



Excelling in Cyber Defense

NightHax Team ranked Top 3% NLC's Cyber Defense program has been recognized as one of the Best 20 Associate Degree Programs in Cybersecurity, and students in the program achieve high scores in various competitions. Most recently, Cyber Defense students, "team Nighthax," ranked in the top 3% in a national Cyber League competition. The event for U.S. collegiate (2yr, 4yr, and graduate) level schools includes challenges from Open-Source Intelligence, Cryptography, Password Cracking, Forensics, and five other categories. The NLC team outscored numerous university and graduate school teams. Additionally, the NLC Cyber Defense program is ranked #25 in the Central Division and #84 nationally in the College Power Rankings, outranking universities like UTSA and Rice University in Texas, and elite schools like Purdue and Ball State at the national level.

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2008 NLC is officially established and offers classes in a renovated building (8300 Pat Booker) while construction is completed on the permanent campus at 1201 Kitty Hawk Rd.

New Beginnings

In Fall, five buildings (Library, Academic, Career Technology, Science and Facilities) open at the new campus (1201 Kitty Hawk Rd.) in northeast Bexar County.

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On November 14, the college held a Ribbon Cutting and Dedication Ceremony for its new campus (more than 500 community members attended).

Completion

The final four buildings (Commons, Wellness, Fine Arts & Performing Arts) are opened on the permanent campus and the Judson Early College Academy (JECA) is constructed on the NLC campus and begins with its first cohort of 125 students.

Impact

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NLC wins Economic Impact Award by Austin-San Antonio Growth Summit for bringing new economic development to the area.

Mathematics Scholars 2015 grant nets \$599K and provides \$10K scholarships to NLC students studying in a math-related field. The goal of the project is to increase the number of graduates in high-demand STEM fields.

Excellence

NLC is one of the first to offer a Robotics Summer Camp for Kids and through partnerships offers \$4500 in scholarships for kids (ages 8-15) to participate in the camp.

"Project Graduation" creates awareness of completion and graduation at the associate degree level and yields more than a 143% increase in graduates.

Facilities Superintendent honored with the Patriot Award, presented by the Office of the Secretary of Defense for being a Patriotic Employer. The award recognizes employers who support a strong National Guard or Reserve.

Achievement

NLC Awards \$500K in scholarships, and annually, awards 96% of scholarship dollars available, one of the highest in the Alamo Colleges District.

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Student Lisa Phillips spearheads the passing of a National Bill to get military working dogs (MWD) reclassified from equipment to canine service members. The Bill was attached to the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) and passed the House and the Senate.

Engagement

Proposed by the college's Anthropology Club, NLC commemorates its 5th anniversary with a time capsule.

Phi Theta Kappa, Academic Honor Society, received 4-Star Chapter Distinction by increasing and enhancing participation on campus and within the region. And received the Distinguished Chapter Officer Team Award in recognition of an exceptional atmosphere of teamwork, and leadership.





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L NLC launches its Adopt-A-School Initiative (A Pathways Program) by partnering with three local schools to N bring the college experience to students along the educational pathway (pre-K to high school).

The Friends of Nighthawks President's Advisory Council is formed with community members and business partners who will advocate for and advance the mission of the college.

NLC Partners with USAA in VetFit™. a new Veteran IT cohort program designed to provide software development training and an internship for recently discharged veterans and military spouses. Program completers received fulltime employment at USAA.

Pathways

NLC named Best **Educational Facility** in the northeast San Antonio/Bexar County region, recognized for its contribution to growth and development in the areas surrounding San Antonio, TX.

More than 2,200 students were impacted by the 2014 - 2015 Adopt-A-School Initiative.

NLC's Adopt-A-School Initiative receives a League for Innovation Award, recognized for its practices, partnerships, and activities that improve the ability of institutions to serve students and the community.

NLC exceeds its target number of graduates.

Quality

NLC receives the **Quality Texas** Foundation (QTF) Pioneer Level Award for its organizational efforts to utilize the beliefs and behaviors of high performance and performance excellence to ensure quality for common stakeholders.

Access

2018

NLC was approved for accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) on December 2017, and received its official notification letter in January 2018.

NLC officially accepts Veteran Benefits and expanded veteran services to include the opening of a small Veterans Center providing personalized assistance with VA benefits, transition services, and other resources.

The College begins offering dual credit classes at Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City ISD high schools.

NLC was part of the Alamo Colleges system's receiving The Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award, the nation's highest presidential honor for performance excellence.



Academic Excellence

Northeast Lakeview College expanded its educational offerings to include students in its first associate of applied science programs (A.A.S.) Cybersecurity and Network Administration Technology.

NLC was awarded the 2018 Platinum Level Healthy Workplace Recognition from the City of San Antonio Mayor's Fitness Council.

Performance

Responding to the global pandemic and forecasting impacts of COVID-19, NLC quickly transitioned to remote working, teaching and learning

NLC receives Progress Level Recognition from the Quality Texas Foundation (QTF) that indicates an effective, systematic approach to organizational management. Received Engagement Level Recognition in 2018, and Commitment Level in 2019.

Phi Theta Kappa honor society named a 2020 REACH chapter by excelling in membership development and increased opportunities for engagement with peers and faculty.

Inclusion & Innovation

Navigating COVID-19, NLC embraced the power of innovation and technology to engage with students, employees, and community.

NLC receives Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) Designation, serving a student body with 25% or more Hispanic students and a high percentage who qualify for federal student aid.

NLC celebrates its newest building with Beam Signing and Topping Out Event; and receives \$7.7M continued investments from the 87th Texas Legislature to construct a stand-alone Veterans building.

NLC's Cyber Defense program named one of 20 best associate degree programs.

Growing Futures Northeast Lakeview

Northeast Lakeview College kicked-off 2022 celebrating its 15th anniversary as an institution and the college hosted several events commemorating NLC's development.

Paluxy Hall opened in August 2022 to serve students, expanding the college's footprint and offering growth to programs in high-wage, in demand careers. Northeast Lakeview College has been named One of 2022 Most Promising Places to work in Community Colleges. 24 community colleges made the list recognized by the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD) and Diverse: Issues in Higher Education. The award is based on criteria that focuses on workplace diversity, staffing practices, and work environment, among other elements. NLC has received this recognition annually since 2019 (2019, 2020, 2021, 2022).

Committed to teaching leadership skills, a NLC student has been selected as either the Student Trustee or Student Trustee Alternate for the Alamo Colleges District Board, since 2018. Northeast Lakeview College student, Cara Sullivan, was named the new student trustee for the Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees

Sullivan's vision for her role as student trustee for the Alamo Colleges is continual connection. As the Alamo Colleges District Student Trustee, Sullivan aims to serve as the bridge between students, the college and the district. Sullivan will also maximize the strengths of the Alamo Colleges District by using positivity and meeting student needs and adapting to promote student success.







Preparing our students for high-wage, in demand careers!

Northeast Lakeview College unveiled its tenth and newest building, Paluxy Hall, in August 2022. At 86,390 sq. ft. the facility provides additional square footage for science, technology, and engineering courses and expanded career and technical program space that will prepare our students for in-demand careers. Future plans for the building include expanding Nursing Programs into NLC's service area. Paluxy Hall also provides collaborative spaces for studying and student engagement, as well as a 3rd floor multi-purpose room, The Bluebonnet Room, with the ability to host large events. The Bluebonnet Room includes one banquet-style room that can be divided into three conference room spaces. 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
