Recognition

Student Success

- Enrollment increased 7.61% from 11,198 (Fall 2015) to 12,050 (Fall 2017)
- SPC awarded 2,023 degrees and certificates exceeding the 2017 WIG of 1,992; this is the highest number conferred in the college's history
- Passion Williams-Toomer, kinesiology student, accepted into the 2017-2018 HBCU All-Star cohort to serve the White House Initiative on HBCUs as a student ambassador

Community Engagement

- SPC VITA program recognized number one in San Antonio; VITA worked with 4,585 tax returns generating more than \$8 million dollars
- SPC awarded the Best Community Partner award by San Antonio for Growth on the Eastside (SAGE)
- Automotive students participated in Carfest 2018, during the event the Community of Automotive Professionals presented SPC with \$20,000 scholarship donation
- SPC Choir sang the proposed Artemisia Bowden Hymn honoring a "Holy Woman: Celebrating a Saint" during the spring concert

- "I, Too, Sing San Antonio", a curated SPC art exhibit featuring 22 African American artists in San Antonio was installed in the Bowden Alumni Center
- 23rd Annual Culturefest and Rib Cook-off in collaboration with Open House introduced approximately 800 high school students to the Alamo Institutes and St. Philip's College
- SPC participated in the Armed Forces River walk Parade
- SPC hosted the U.S. Secretary of Education HBCU Capital Finance Meeting
- SPC hosted the National Association of HBCU Title III Administrators Region VI Workshop

Institutional Advancement and Sustainability

- SPC awarded the Pre-K for SA \$20,000 grant benefitting the Child Development Center
- Cowboy Breakfast Foundation presented SPC with \$20,000; their highest amount donated
- Alamo Colleges District \$450 Million bond proposal passed; SPC allocation is \$82 Million for building construction and renovation
- SPC completed a \$7 Million renovation of Good Samaritan Veterans Outreach & Transition Center and a \$12 million renovation of the Everett L. Turbon Student Center
- Department of Justice awarded SPC a three-year sexual assault prevention \$299,910 grant, recognizing SPC as a Violence against Women Sexual Assault Free Environment Safe Space; only 53 in the nation with this designation
- Anthony family donated \$200,000 for the Michael D. Anthony Endowed Scholarship at SPC
- Annual fundraising activities produced \$148,063 in scholarship funds
