Student Success

- SPC launched the Safe SPaCE Student Success program and the Advocacy Center to include food pantry grab-and-go services.
- SPC provides comprehensive co-Curricular activities to students.
- The three-year student loan default rate of SPC students has decreased from 23.4% (FY10) to 10.8% (FY15).
- In December 2018, SPC conferred 664 degrees and certificates.
- SPC experienced longitudinal increases in persistence for full time FTIC students from 49.5% (AY14) to 56.9% (AY18) and part-time FTIC students from 36.8% (AY14) to 40.6% (AY17).
