

## READING FOR UNDERSTANDING (RFU) LEVEL “K”



Reading for understanding (RFU) exercises are for students to practice understanding what they read in short readings. A student must read a selection and analyze the material in the reading using prior knowledge to arrive at the correct answer. If the student does not have prior knowledge of the subject in the reading, the student can utilize dictionaries or other references to arrive at the correct answer. It is an excellent exercise for the reader to utilize various levels of Bloom’s Taxonomy.

## Answer key to RFU Box # 2, Card # 71 ▲

- (1) Correct answer is “A.” The key word in the reading is *protection*. When a person wants protection, he or she wants safety. This is mentioned in answer “A.”
- (2) Correct answer is “D.” Since the reading mentions that ships were used to carry the bigger loads, you must realize that ships need water to travel, thus countries located near water developed commercially.
- (3) Correct answer is “D.” Although the reading mentions Greece and Olympics, the answer should be based on the distance that was run by Pheidippides, which was very long.
- (4) Correct answer is “D.” When something is shrinking, it will eventually disappear. If you are familiar with frogs and know that they are tadpoles before growing up, this should be easy to answer.
- (5) Correct answer is “B.” The reading states that the sting only paralyzes the prey, so “C” is not the answer; the wasp would not provide unsuitable food for its young, thus “A” is not the answer. The answer then should be either “B” or “D,” “B” is the logical answer.
- (6) Correct answer is “C.” When you give concessions, you are being generous, since she didn’t give these, then she hated generosity.
- (7) Correct answer is “B.” When you combine Europe and Asia, you come up with the blend or portmanteau word, *Eurasia*.
- (8) Correct answer is “A.” When you use the finest seeds from the finest plants you are improving crops.
- (9) Correct answer is “D.” The reading states that Achilles was only vulnerable on his heel by which his mother held him while plunging him into the river, thus his heel is the only place where he could be killed.
- (10) Correct answer is “B.” To eliminate bacteria, the bacteria must die. All living things need water/moisture.

## Answer key to RFU Box # 2, Card # 72 ■

- (1) Correct answer is “D.” When water is eliminated from an area, you will have a desert; this causes lakes to dry up.
- (2) Correct answer is “C.” When words are coming from our mouths, we are not the audience, critic, or originator. Mouthpiece is the logical answer.
- (3) Correct answer is “B.” In this reading they are stating that the work being done is the same over and over, uniform. Changing the activity, what is being done, will be sort of a recreation for the person.
- (4) Correct answer is “A.” Another word for gown is dress, thus “A” is the logical answer.
- (5) Correct answer is “A.” This reading offers a challenge in that the reader must use logic to come up with the answer. “D” cannot be the answer because all chairs perform the same function; the function is not unique. “C” cannot be the answer because most companies maintain consistent quality, thus it would not affect the outcome. “B” cannot be the answer because low-price alone will not produce profits.
- (6) Correct answer is “A.” Answers “B” and “D” are not correct because volume and frequency of speaking do not affect correct language usage. Untactfully, also does not affect correct language usage. A dictionary would help in this question.
- (7) Correct answer is “C.” The average person knows that the wind does not always blow, so it would be logical that a motorized pump could be used better when this happens.
- (8) Correct answer is “D.” Monarchy and republic do not deal with spreading information, thus “A” and “B” are not correct. Herald means speaking out which would not be heard in all places. A newspaper can be sent to many places, thus the correct answer.
- (9) Correct answer is “A.” The word abundant means plentiful or a lot. Vegetation, plants, need water. Thus vegetation would not be absent or sparse, or parched. It would be luxuriant, profuse, abundant, etc.
- (10) Correct answer is “B.” Realist, genius, and scientist are words use to note something good about a person. Madman is used to describe a person put in a bad light, or made fun of.

## Answer key for (RFU) Box # 2, Card # 73 ▲

- (1) Correct answer is “A.” When a society pillages and raids other villages, it is making war against them thus the god of thunder and war would be their chief deity.
- (2) Correct answer is “B.” The key word here is stored, which is where ore is found. So forests store wood, for building and paper products.
- (3) Correct answer is “D.” In this reading the idea that is being brought out is that each group thinks the other group is being preferred.
- (4) Correct answer is “A.” The place where people feel better is in their minds, not in any other area.
- (5) Correct answer is “C.” If a bee works with wood to build its home, it is safe to say that it is a carpenter bee since carpenters work with wood.
- (6) Correct answer is “C.” The key to this question is “experience”; she was writing about what happened to her and she figures that many people have the similar experiences that she encountered.
- (7) Correct answer is “B.” Something worse than losing an arm would be what? Death.
- (8) Correct answer is “D.” If you make up the words as you go along singing, then you should not use something that has been used before.
- (9) Correct answer is “C.” Key word is “trick.” A trick would be to distort things not make them clear, a different color, or make someone ugly.
- (10) Correct answer is “A.” Since the wasp cannot carry the grasshopper away, it has to live close to where it is captured.
