Disability Services (DS) office is committed to providing all students with equal access to a quality education and providing reasonable accommodations to eligible students. In addition to serving as an advocate for students with disabilities, our office also works closely with faculty and staff members to monitor students' progress and encourage a positive educational experience.

High School versus College

College is different from the high school system with regard to students with disabilities. College does not require parental involvement. The student must meet the expectations of each course/program. Accommodations are provided not modified.

Student Responsibilities

- ◆ Meeting the academic or technical standards of the course/program/college.
- ◆ Identifying him or herself as a student with a disability to the Disability Office at each college enrolled
- ◆ Initiate accommodations and work with instructors
- ◆ Identify needed resources, disability-specific and general, and use those resources to help academically, personally, and financially

Guidelines for On-Campus and Online Students

ESTABLISHING NEW SERVICES

1. Complete the "Request for Disability Services for Class Accommodations" Form online or in person;
2. A copy of your disability documentation must be on file with the Disability Services office prior to providing accommodation;
3. Schedule an appointment by visiting www.calendly.com/mbotello or in person to SLC 102 to determine eligibility;
4. If eligible, appropriate accommodations outlined in the Letter of Accommodation
5. Letters of Accommodations emailed to student and instructor

RENEWING SERVICES

1. Complete "Request for Disability Services for Class Accommodations" Form online or in person, SLC 102
2. Letter of Accommodation emailed to student and instructor
